

MAINE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The federal *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB)* requires all states, school districts, and schools to provide annual report cards to parents and communities that include <u>Maine Comprehensive Assessment System (MeCAS)</u> data disaggregated into subgroups, attendance and graduation rates, status of Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), and information on "highly qualified" teachers. This report card also displays statewide academic achievement results in grades four and eight on the <u>National Assessment of</u> <u>Educational Progress (NAEP)</u> reading and mathematics assessments, as well as the participation rates for students with disabilities and limited English proficiency on the exam. Maine's NCLB Report Cards contain the following information:

MeCAS Assessment Data 2010-2011: Assessment data for reading and mathematics are provided for Grades 3-8 and high school, as well as for science for grades 5, 8, and high school. Data is disaggregated to explain performance by subgroups. The MeCAS data is from the tests given in the fall of 2010 (Grade 3-8), spring of 2011 (High School), spring of 2011 (Alternate Assessment-Science), and spring of 2010 (Alternate Assessment-Reading and Mathematics).

Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP): Accountability information is provided for how well districts and schools are progressing toward all students being proficient in reading and mathematics. This system has been established to comply with the accountability provisions of NCLB, which require, among other things, that each school makes AYP toward meeting a national goal of all students being "proficient" in reading and mathematics by the school year 2013-2014.

Qualifications of Teachers: Information about the qualifications of teachers is provided for three areas: 1) the professional qualifications of teachers; 2) the percentage of teachers with emergency or conditional certificates; and 3) the percentage of classes not taught by teachers who are highly qualified in core academic areas such as mathematics, science, social studies, etc. This data is intended to help you understand the backgrounds and preparation of the teachers who are working with your child.

National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP): Data from the 2008-2009 NAEP results is displayed, allowing you to evaluate the performance of students in Maine with the performance of students across the nation or in other states. Students take the NAEP in reading and mathematics every two years. When reviewing these results, it is important to keep in mind that the NAEP results are based on a sample of schools and students across Maine, not all Maine schools and students.
